David Stevens is the curator of Madison's Longnecker Horticultural Gardens. Previously, he spent 13 years working in the field of forest tree genetics with the UW-Madison Forest and Wildlife Ecology Department. David has a BS in horticulture from Virginia Tech and an MS in horticulture from UW-Madison. When not at the Arboretum, he manages his family's certified organic farm by Baraboo.

Dave Wanninger is the Horticulturist in Charge at Boerner Botanical Gardens in Hales Corners, Wisconsin. Previously, Dave worked many years as Horticulturist at Beaver Creek Nursery and Klehm's Song Sparrow Farm. Before that, Dave operated a landscaping company and was the nursery manager at a large independent garden center. He was also a longtime Instructor in the Horticulture program at Blackhawk Technical College in Janesville, Wisconsin.

Kathy Lemley, Ph.D. teaches human anatomy and neuroscience in the Occupational and Physical Therapy programs at Concordia University. Her research focuses on pain perception and exercise for pain management across the lifespan.

Yvonne Brault has had many photos published in the national American Rose magazine and in the national calendar, and won many ribbons in their rose photography contest. She is an active photo exhibitor and just competed in the photo contest in October at the San Diego national rose convention.
